Report to ICA Building on the date and time stipulated in the notification letter to register for Singapore Citizenship (typically 3-4 weeks from date of the letter) 	Typically, the Ceremony will be held 3–6 months after successful applicants have completed Stage 3. The Pink Identity Card (also known as NRIC) and SC Certificate will be presented to at the Citizenship Ceremony that is specially organised to welcome all new citizens!
